**N.B.** Mass Intention envelopes for Holy Souls are in the vestibule. If you would like to request a Mass please write the name/ names on the envelope. The suggested offering for **one Mass** is \$10 [cash only]. Please use one envelope for each Mass you wish to request. Thank you.

**DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER** we especially remember our deceased family, friends and benefactors. As in the past our Parish Book of Remembrance with the names of our deceased friends and loved ones will be placed at the foot of the altar for all Masses during the month of November. **Please keep in mind that names that have already been recorded need not be recorded again.** Names that you wish to enter can be emailed to the parish office before **12:00noon on October 28<sup>th</sup>** and they will be recorded in our Book of Remembrance. Thank You.

## **PLEASE NOTE: Indulgences for All Saints Octave**

1. **An indulgence**, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from the first to the eighth of November; on other days of the year it is partial.

2. **A plenary indulgence**, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed [November 2<sup>nd</sup>] as well as on the Sunday preceding or following, and on All Saints' Day [November 1<sup>st</sup>] piously visit a church. In visiting the church it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

- To acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary also to fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental Confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father. The three conditions may be fulfilled several days or before or after the performance of the visit; it is, however, fitting that communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father be said on the same day as the visit.
- The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of the day.

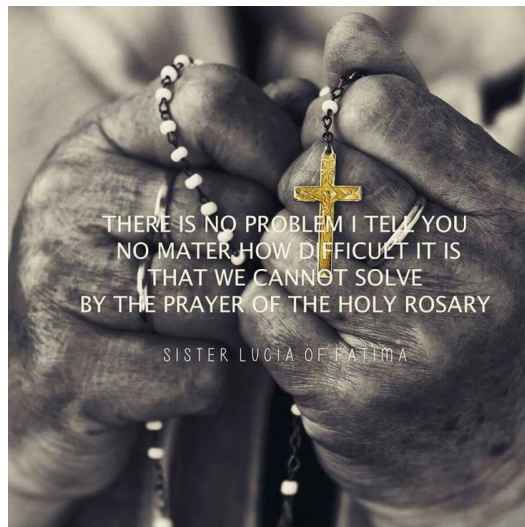

Dear Parishioners,

As you know, Fr. Rodney is away until the end of month, returning on Tuesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. He has asked me to give you an update of parish activities, and it is my pleasure to do so.

September ushered in Fall and the start of our Tuesday socials. All are welcome downstairs after 9:00am Tuesday Masses for a cup of tea/coffee and some goodies, and to chat with Father and meet new friends. I have had the pleasure of meeting a few of you this way and am grateful for the opportunity.

September was also the start of our parish Alpha, an evangelization program experienced by over 30 million people worldwide. Held at the JP II Centre, our weekly gatherings have been enriching. Our team of 11 is hosting 33 guests, and as we head into session 5 (of 14 in total), what we are seeing instead of the average 30% drop-out rate is an increase in attendance, and most participants are 20 – 40 years of age: the biggest age category missing from Church. Please keep us in prayer, especially with our November 12<sup>th</sup> all-day retreat just around the corner.

The CWL held an inspiring Fall recollection led by Sister Angela Marie Castellani, FSE. Based on the Samaritan woman at the well, Sister led us through several reflections, from identifying the wells we are drawing water from that still leave us thirsty, to Jesus' own thirst for us as He, the bridegroom of our souls, offers himself as living water.

We had two special September Masses in our church: The Nativity of Mary closing Mass, attended by several Legion of Mary praesidia, and a Healing Mass celebrated by Fr. Lou Cerulli, well-attended by visitors from various parishes.

Additionally, most of our Service Team attended a Divine Renovation presentation with several pastors and their teams, held at the JP II Centre. We discussed the 3 keys to parish renewal:

- The Power of the Holy Spirit, with prayer as the force behind parish mission and work
- The Primacy of Evangelization as the priority of every parish, the goal being conversion
- The Best of Leadership by pooling gifts and strengths in a team that works toward a vision

October is the month of the Holy Rosary and the feasts of so many popular saints. After a beautiful Marian Mass celebrated by Fr. Arsene on the patronal feast of our diocese - the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary - we honored her with the Joyful and Luminous mysteries prayed outdoors, accompanied by song and sunshine. And on October 14<sup>th</sup> - the 96<sup>th</sup> birthday of Anne Trudell - we held the first Seniors Thanksgiving Tea since Covid at the JP II Centre. Though Anne could not attend, we were graced by the presence of Bishop Monroe, Fr. Holland, and Fr. Rodney. Many thanks to the Tea Committee and our group of volunteers for their hard work and dedication.

On a miscellaneous note: our drain tile repairs are completed, our hall renovations await a permit from City Hall, PREP has 7 students enrolled for First Communion and 3 students for Confirmation, and the Archbishop's scheduled parish visit in December has been indefinitely postponed. Also, please mark Friday, November 4<sup>th</sup>, at 5:00—9:00pm on your calendars for what will be a beautiful evening of song & praise at our church, organized by Catholic Christian Outreach. Come, everyone, to worship Jesus!

By the time you read this, the Upper Room Conference organized by Proclaim to promote evangelization in the Archdiocese will have ended. May the Holy Spirit bless the fruits of the conference so that we take our missionary call to heart. As Pope St. Paul VI wrote, evangelizing is the Church's deepest identity. *"She exists in order to evangelize."*

Lastly, we mourn the loss of two very holy and remarkable priests in our Archdiocese. Fr. José Luis Soria, widely regarded as "canonizable", was the personal doctor of St. Josemaría Escrivá, who died in his arms. He served our clergy for years by offering them spiritual direction before a few strokes left him without speech. Fr. Joe was my spiritual guide for two decades. Fr. John Horgan, a giant in every way, was well-known and loved by so many. He was my pastor for years at Sts. Peter & Paul, where people would come, even from long distances, to attend his Masses and listen to his scholarly homilies. The three funeral Masses for Fr. Horgan will be posted on our bulletin boards. Requiescat in Pace, Fathers Joe and John. We will miss you.
