Parking At Our Church

As our neighbourhood grows up, the number of available parking spots goes down! Here are some travel tips for commuting to Holy Name:

- Carpool. Can you pick up your neighbour on the way to Sunday Mass or daily Mass? Please leave your name and number and closest intersection with the parish office for a possible match. Thank you for helping!
- Arrive early. The church is open at least 30 minutes before Mass on weekdays and 1 hour before Mass on Sundays. On Saturdays, come early for confession at 4pm. More time to pray!
- Park southbound on Cambie St. (north of W. 33rd Ave.). These are free street parking spots on weekdays until 3pm, and unlimited parking all day Saturday & Sunday.
- Take public transit. The 15 Cambie bus stop #50422 is right on our front doorstep.
 - Walking tip: If you are taking the Canada Line, the walk *from* Oakridge-41st Station to our church is downhill, and the walk leaving our church *to* King Edward Station is downhill.
- **Bike.** Our church has its own bike rack (donated by a generous parishioner in 2022) which has parking for at least 5 bikes (including large e-bikes).

NOTICE: Parking in the rectory driveway is reserved 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for on-duty staff and volunteers. <u>Never</u> block the garage door or you will be towed at your own expense.
