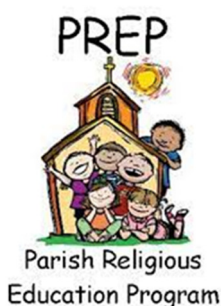
DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER we especially remember our deceased family, friends and benefactors. As in the past our Parish Book of Remembrance with the names of our deceased friends and loved ones will be placed at the foot of the altar for all Masses during the month of November.

PLEASE NOTE: Indulgences for All Saints Octave

1. **An indulgence**, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from the first to the eighth of November; on other days of the year it is partial.

2. **A plenary indulgence**, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed [November 2nd] as well as on the Sunday preceding or following, and on All Saints' Day [November 1st] piously visit a church. In visiting the church it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

- To acquire a plenary indulgence it is necessary also to fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental Confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father. The three conditions may be fulfilled several days or before or after the performance of the visit; it is, however, fitting that communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Holy Father be said on the same day as the visit.
- The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy father is fully satisfied by reciting one Our Father and one Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of the day.



On the **32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time**, six PREP children were enrolled for First Communion. Please pray for all our PREP children who meet every week to learn about Jesus Christ and his Church.

Spirit Day 2022: Resurrection! On November 5th, over 1200 Grade 7 youth from around our Archdiocese gathered to ignite the fire of the Holy Spirit within

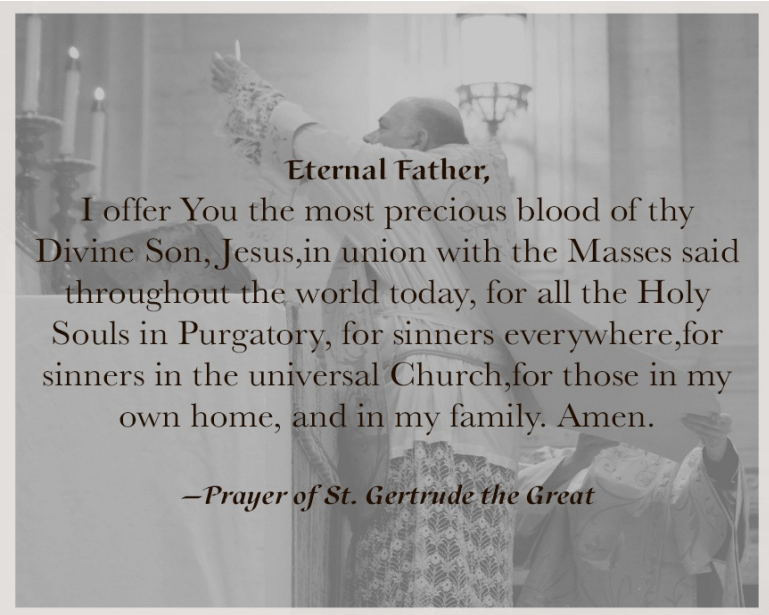

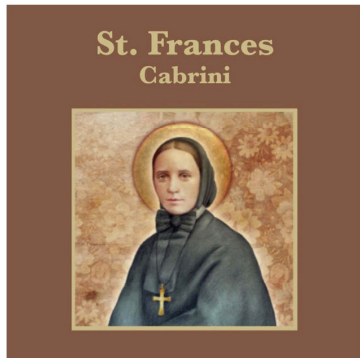

St. Giuseppe Moscati: Doctor to the Poor

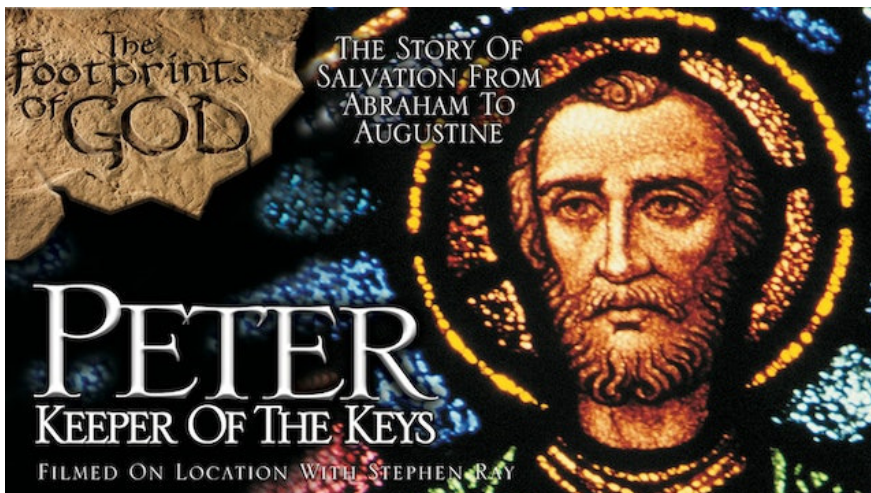
