According to St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, "When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you then. When you look at the Sacred Host, you understand how much Jesus loves you now." Now. The Eucharist is the Sacrament of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. Because You Will Increase in Holiness by Bathing in the Light of the Son

People enjoy tanning in the sunlight during summer or visit tanning salons. Going to Eucharistic Adoration does for your soul what a tanning salon does for your skin— it transforms it. Too much physical light burns. If you stay before the light of the Son, before long your sins will be identified.

Eucharistic adoration is a precursor to confession. St. Clare of Assisi proclaimed, "Gaze upon him, consider him, contemplate him, as you desire to imitate him." Standing in the "Sonlight" will lead you to think like the Son. You will be more patient. Kinder. Gentler. More obedient to your parents, spouse, priests, bishop or other spiritual authorities in your life. Bathe in the light of the Son and be prepared for noticeable results.
